BY THE NUMBERS

Numbers do not always tell the whole story, of course. But as I thought about what to write in this May Newsletter there were a few numbers that crossed my – and I'd thought I'd share them with you. So try these on for size:

253 – Our attendance at last month's Easter Sunday worship service. We typically have large crowds on the day we celebrate our Lord's resurrection, but no one I spoke with could recall a crowd as big as this. For a church that averages somewhere between 135-165 on any given Sunday, this was truly amazing. Thanks to the folks who grabbed all the chairs from the choir room downstairs to accommodate the large crowd (and those who put the chairs back too!) From the Flowering of the Cross to the exquisite music, it was a worship experience certainly befitting of the occasion. He is risen indeed! He still is.

30 – The number of people who took part in the Easter Journey during the wee hours of Good Friday morning. Beginning at midnight and concluding at 7am, these folks literally walked in the footsteps of Jesus' last day, from the Last Supper in the Upper Room to the Garden of Gethsemane, from the trial and crucifixion to the empty tomb. Most of the group were youth, but a number of adults took part in it as well.

137 – The number of folks who are members of our church's Facebook group (and they're not all church members, incidentally). If you're not on facebook, it's a great way to reconnect with folks from your past and present and keep in touch. The church's Facebook group (which you can access at: facebook.fpcma.com) enables people to receive updates and interact with one another on the web. Join us!

10 – The number of confirmands our church welcomed into membership this past Sunday – the largest group of confirmands we've ever had. And not only are they strong in numbers, but strong in their faith as well. Congrats to these fine folks, and tremendous thanks to the ten mentors who guided them along the way!

One last number for you.....

300+ - the number of members of First Presbyterian Church of Mount Airy. With this recent class of confirmands our church has passed the 300-member mark. And this is where I come back to my initial point: numbers do not tell the full story. We are not an important church because we have 300 members. We're an important church because we have a fellowship of believers who are committed to living out Jesus' commandment to love God and one another, following Jesus into our community and our world. Our church will never morph into some mega-church (nor do we necessarily want it to) – but we are grateful that 300+ people have felt called to be part of this fellowship of faith!

By the numbers – and by many other indicators – God has richly blessed this church. Let's give thanks to God by showing God the same faithfulness God has shown us!

SESSION DIGEST

From Stated Session Meeting held on April 19, 2009

Treasurer's Report: reviewed financial highlights through March. Revenues and expenditures are tracking as expected. The line of credit with Surrey Bank will be paid off in April. The session approved the Treasurer's Report.

Worship and Music: Response appears to be very positive to moving the Easter worship service to 10:00am. Attendance that morning was 253 people!

Youth: Venture Crew requested use of the church's tax ID number for their bank account. Bank statements will be forwarded to the Treasurer, who will report to the Session. The church will not manage the group's funds. A motion was made and approved allowing use of the ID number.

Missions: Work continues on establishment of a charity coat closet. The team is also looking into ways to assist the school lunch program, possibly working with other churches.

Discipleship: Passed out results of the time and talent surveys. Team leaders were encouraged to contact those who offered help in their areas.

Personnel: Passed out information regarding establishing a procedure for sabbatical leave.

Buildings and Grounds: Reported that the water heater in the older part of the church needs to be replaced.

Long Range Planning: Reported that her team is scheduling appointments for pictures for the new church directory.

Session examined ten confirmands: Catherine Beal, Sam Brown, Jai Daniels, Joseph Dixon, Sarah Dodd, Claire Draughn, Mary Glen Hatcher, Anna Merritt, Madison Pence, and Cody Swicegood. Each presented his/her statement of faith and recited the Apostles Creed with the session. Motion was unanimously passed to sustain their examinations and welcome them into membership. Motion was also passed for the sacrament of baptism for Joseph Dixon and Madison Pence on April 26th. The Session recognized and thanked the mentors: Cecelia Belk, Sandy Bowers, Margaret Cockerell, Laura East, Mike Gatchel, Bob Keck, Pepper Mayes, Kathy Moody, Jane Rountree, and Debbie Stoltz.

Session approved the use of the sanctuary for Sarah Stroupe's wedding on Saturday, June 27th.

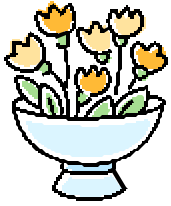

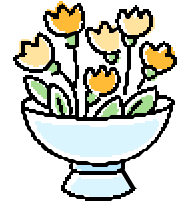

Three R's"
Highlights of the Green Team
"It is a good land that the Lord our God is giving us."

Deuteronomy 1:25b

In April, the Green Team had the privilege to host the Confirmation Luncheon. As part of our ongoing efforts to promote environmental stewardship, the Green Team challenged the congregation to reduce the waste created during this event. Our goal was to create only one bag of trash by encouraging luncheon attendees to bring and use their own reusable place setting vice using disposable products like paper plates and cups and plastic flatware. Participation was overwhelming. There were approximately 120 people in attendance in which over 80 people accepted the challenge, reducing the waste we usually create by greater than 50%. Typical waste creation is on the order of 5 bags for an event of this size and we ended up creating only 1.5 bags of trash. That's 3.5 bags of garbage that we kept out of the landfill.

Great job everyone!

As always, the entire congregation is invited to participate on the Green Team. The simplest form of involvement is by supporting initiatives like above or by volunteering to take the church's recycling to the drop off center. 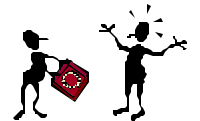
